


### Newberry National Volcanic Monument

## **Paulina Lake Hot Springs Information**



Paulina Lake Hot Springs area is a primitive, undeveloped beach where heated spring water is emerging in Paulina Lake.

To access the Paulina Lake Hot Springs hike the Paulina Lakeshore Loop Trail, and there is a <u>marked</u> spur trail leading to the Hot Springs area. For more information please visit the Paulina Visitor Center or call Lava Lands Visitor Center at 541-593-2421 (open May-mid-Oct).



Leave No Trace Ethics to be followed:

- 1. Day Use ONLY (beyond this point) -NO dispersed camping in Newberry Caldera.
- 2. Primitive pools exist. This is a riparian zone, please do not dig (36 CFR 261.9(a)).
- 3. Pack it in, pack it out. (Don't be a litter bug!) Keep this place beautiful.
- 4. Stay on the trail—the Hot Springs spur trail is marked.
- 5. No facilities at the Hot Springs-please bury human waste 6-8" deep, at least 200ft or 75 large steps from water, pack out paper products.

Leave No Trace Ethics to be followed:

- 1. Day Use ONLY beyond this point-NO dispersed camping in Newberry Caldera.
- 2. Primitive pools exist. This is a riparian zone, please do not dig (36 CFR 261.9(a)).
- 3. Pack it in, pack it out. Don't be a litter bug!
- 4. Stay on the trail—the Hot Springs spur trail is marked.
- 5. No facilities at the Hot Springs-please bury waste 6-8" deep, at least 200ft or 75 large steps from water, pack out paper products.

# **East Lake Hot Springs Information**



East Lake Hot Springs area is a primitive, undeveloped area where heated spring water is emerging in East Lake.

East Lake Hot Springs area is located between Hot Springs Boat ramp and East Lake Campground on the lakeshore. To access the hot springs area walk along the waters edge until you find bubbling water ((please avoid damaging) Do not damage vegetation). In spring, the East Lake Hot Springs are submerged in the lake due to high lake levels, and become

exposed in late July or when the (lake) water level drops. If you come to a point where you can no longer walk the shoreline, then the hot springs are still submerged. For more information please visit the Paulina Visitor Center or call Lava Lands Visitor Center at 541-593-2421 (open May-mid-Oct).

#### Leave No Trace Ethics to be followed:

- 1. Day Use ONLY (beyond this point)-NO dispersed camping in Newberry Caldera.
- 2. Primitive pools exist. This is a riparian zone, please do not dig (36 CFR 261.9(a)).
- 3. Pack it in, pack it out. (Don't be a litter bug!) Keep this place beautiful!
- 4. No facilities at the hot springs-please walk back to a developed toilet facility to use the restroom.
